

You Must File Your Sales and Use Tax Return Online Beginning May 2018

CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF TAX AND FEE ADMINISTRATION

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The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA) is improving our online services, making them more convenient for you. Beginning in May 2018, your sales and use tax account will be moved to our new system. The following information explains this transition.

- You must file your Sales and Use Tax Returns using the new online system if you do not have an active online filing exemption.
- Transactions that were previously reported on Schedule F have been divided into these two online schedules:
 - (1) Schedule F- Detailed Allocation by City of Taxable Transactions for Lessor of Motor Vehicles
- (2) Schedule H Detailed Allocation by City on Qualifying Transactions of \$500,000 or more
- If you report bad debt lender losses, the new online Schedule Q Tax Recovery, will be required to report your losses in place of Schedules A and L.
- If you file on a quarterly basis, and do not have an online filing exemption, this will be your last paper return.
- If you file on a monthly or a quarterly prepay basis, and do not have an online filing exemption, your last paper return or a prepayment form will be mailed in April 2018.
